An exemplary lawyer and recipient of an L.L.M degree from Harvard Law School, Mr. Mangi, while establishing himself as an outstanding and highly regarded attorney in his private practice, has successfully pursued justice as a pro bono lawyer on behalf of many groups and individuals.
