## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Pesticide Injury Ac-

5 countability Act of 2025".

## 6 SEC. 2. PRIVATE RIGHT OF ACTION FOR INJURIES CAUSED 7 BY PESTICIDES.

8 The Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide

9 Act (7 U.S.C. 136 et seq.) is amended—

(1) by redesignating sections 34 and 35 (7
 U.S.C. 136x, 136y) as sections 35 and 36, respec tively; and

4 (2) by inserting after section 33 (7 U.S.C.

6 "SEC. 34. PRIVATE RIGHT OF ACTION FOR INJURIES
7 CAUSED BY PESTICIDES.

8 "(a) IN GENERAL.—Any person the property or per-9 son of which is injured by a pesticide may bring a civil 10 action in Federal district court against a registrant of the 11 pesticide for monetary damages for injury to the property 12 or person caused by the pesticide.

13 "(b) RECOVERABLE DAMAGES.—Monetary damages
14 that may be recovered in a civil action under subsection
15 (a)—

16 "(1) include compensatory and punitive dam-17 ages, at the discretion of the court; and

18 "(2) do not include attorney's fees or court19 costs.

20 "(c) EFFECT.—Nothing in this section shall preempt21 any State law claim.".
